The book "The Meaning of Ice" are in the starting point a unintended result of a scientific research project called " Siku-Inuit-Hila- Weather Project" supported by US National Science Foundation. Geographical streched it between three places in Artic; Barrow in Alaska, Kangigtugaapik in Canada and Qaanaag on Greenland. And over time from 2006 to 2010. The scientific reseach project as was leaded by Dr. Eddy Carmark together with a team receving a prize winter 2018 named the "Mohn award". Formally was it several scientific organisations in North of Norway as stud behind the distrubution. But the award on 2 million krones was supported by a privat person. If you tried to understand what the award was all about from the presstexts on net - so could you come to think that it was something as fore the most was about scientific and resarch fare away from people most - and as not at all had to do with topics as this magazine are busy of; hide, leather, fur and art and craft. And you would, as the publisher of this magazin, perhaps stumble over the book, if you seeked on the netpages - and also find out, in case you brought the book, that it in much and many is about exactly what this magazin is busy with; hide, leather, fur and art and craft. But in variations as not longer are so usual in Norway as in a row of years have fighted against use of hide and fur from Arctic. So I get little doubt about the purpose behind the award – and particular when the book, as in spit of it all, fare on the way, explain,. will I belive, what the scientific research prosject was all about - hardly was mentioned in connection to the award distrubution as took place in

Tromsø in North of Norway. And , based on the information the magazin have; not was for sale in a ordinary bookshop, eigther in Tromsø or the country without it was particular ordered. Naiv enough I thought it was exhibited in the bokkstore windows with flowers and flag around in the opportunity as the award distrubution gave - and by that accessible fore those as could be interested of it, as a popular part of polar science, in a city where you ones only needed to go down to the harbour in the morning to get the last world news about the investigation of arctic and where it was a topic around allmost every table at supper. But like that was it not with this book with background in the research project as received the award - and as first time (!) was published in 2013. It's not written by one author, but have a editorial group on 8 editors. And the content exist of many small storys told by the people as live in arctic on the allready mentioned places in Alaska, Canada and Greenland. They tell about how they understand theire life by living on and of what the ice give them via storys as circle about : ice, home, food, freedom on ice, tools used on ice, and clothes. And not less; the changes they experience because of the ice mealting and hunting restrictions. But in the background of if you get a presentiment that it also circle around art and craft and the material the ice give: hide, leather, fur,horn, different tooths and a variation of bones. But first of all give the book a possibility to come closer arctic neighbouring nations, to understand how they live, think and act on both a local and international level. And not seen through a filter of sience. But by the peoples owns words. It have by that become a public friendly book, something as probably was the intention by making it. It's worth to remember, that this book not was included in the starting point of the scinetific recearh program. It grow out of it, of necessity, to communicate with the sourounding world?. A another side of the situation is also that Tromsø have got the mention "Arctic capital" and that in itself should you belive was with on to create interest fore other people in arctic - and a book as "The Meaning of Ice". But the award distrubution was not at all set up like that. When you see the way millions and billions of krones are used by private and the public can you not avoid to ask why not even one-1- krone is used to present a book, as in its contemporary time and after probably will come stay central in the popular arctic science litteratur. And why not a krone was used to translate it, because it is probably not everyone who have a interest of this type of books as read english. We are still a norwegian language nation. A other small, but not indifferent point, is that this book also have a place in the popular arctic litterature tradition as is in Tromsø from before. And the book could be a unmeasureable cultural impulse in the continuing of both the award distribution and the development of Tromsø as a "Arctic capital" as not only can be a political byword. Well,.....the book have 370 pages and a enormous and beatutiful photo material, drawings and illustrations.
